The role involves collaborating with schools, students, community partners, and stakeholders, and ensuring the success of program objectives. The Coordinator will be responsible for fostering an inclusive environment that encourages students to develop and execute a vocational/educational plan.

Key Responsibilities

- Coordinate and implement the Project Discovery program across schools and community centers.
- Develop and maintain partnerships with local schools, universities, employers, trade schools, workforce development boards, community organizations, and additional stakeholders.
- Organize and lead workshops, college tours, mentoring sessions, and other educational activities for students.
- Track program progress and maintain accurate records of student participation, outcomes, and success metrics.
- Collaborate with local schools, community providers, and alternative educational networks to identify and recruit eligible students from underrepresented communities.
- Provide academic and career coaching to students.
- Prepare regular reports and updates for program stakeholders, including funders and school districts.
- Manage and support a team of volunteers, mentors, and interns involved in the program.
- Promote student engagement and parent involvement to enhance student success.

- Monitor the program's budget and ensure compliance with financial policies.
- Ensure the program aligns with state and federal educational regulations and standards.
